## John 16:16-24, "Your Sorrow Will Turn into Joy"

Last Sunday: The Advantageous Work of the Holy Spirit

**Today**: Your Sorrow Will Turn into Joy

<u>16:16</u>/ "A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me." - ???

- 1. This refers to Christ in his crucifixion and resurrection (Cyril of Alexandria).
- 2. This refers to Christ's ascension and second coming (Augustine of Hippo).

16:19/ "Jesus knew that they wanted to ask him..."

Why did they not ask Jesus?

- 1. Their lack of any sort of prototype. The disciples could not comprehend a Messiah who came to the earth, died, rose again, left and then sent another in his place (Ps. 22, Is. 53).
  - a. Frederic Godet, "Where for us all is <u>clear</u>, for them all was *mysterious*. If Jesus wished to found the Messianic kingdom, why go away? If He does not wish it, why return?" (Morris, 624).
- 2. Their lack of humility, mixed with fear. Earlier they had been bragging about which one of them was the greatest in the kingdom of God.
  - a. James 4:2, "You have not because you ask not..."

16:20/ "You will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice."

- Weep  $(\kappa\lambda\alpha i\omega)$  to cry with a loud wailing; frequently occurs in regards to someone's death
- Lament (θρηνέω) loud crying with manifestations like tearing clothes, wearing sackcloth, hitting one's chest; it mostly occurs amongst the community (Mt. 23:37).

<u>16:23</u>/ "In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you."

Two more reasons for joy:

- 1. The joy of understanding
- 2. The joy of effectual prayer
